

When you scan the QR code or enter this URL into your web browser, you will be taken to the login page of the ballot site.


Enter your credentials if you have previously registered.






Logging In

When logging in to vote after pre-registration, you **MUST** login with the same information you registered with. So if you registered as a “guest” using your email address, you will need to enter your email address in the “Card No. or Email” field. If you registered with your IMAW card/book number, you will enter that when logging in.
